Primary Functions of Position

Individuals who show strong character and who are passionate about service and leadership will be representatives for our center, will be responsible for planning and executing several service-learning projects, and will assist in office management and operational duties.

Duties & Responsibilities

Primary Responsibilities:

- Responsible for creating and leading two high-impact projects/initiatives/events that embody the value of leadership, service, responsible citizenship, and ethics. These projects should address communities' needs through education, leadership, and service (example areas for impact could be: gender issues, cultural competency, hunger & homelessness, global health, disaster relief, etc). Each project should include the following components: education, empowerment, and opportunities for further engagement. Projects should be researched, well prepared and impactful.
- As an intern team, support the implementation of other interns' high-impact projects/initiatives
- Promote leaders for change initiatives across campus striving for a diverse audience.
- Engage campus and community partners in the development and/or executive of projects.
- Attend meetings with supervisor and intern team

Secondary responsibilities:

- Develop and facilitate team-building and leadership trainings for ambassadors and other audiences as needed
- Maintain a sense of community within the CSLEPS office
- Provide support for existing and ongoing CSLEPS initiatives that have been implemented
- Maintain and establish relationships with CSLEPS community partners (i.e. presenting/collaborating with other offices/organizations such as Student Government, Student Centers Board of Directors, Student Involvement and more)
- Any other duties as assigned

Qualifications

- Current student in good standing with the university
- Must be available to work approximately 10 hours per week, including select evening and weekend availability to assist with service projects
- Creative, innovative, and have desire to learn and to willingness to develop leadership ability
- Demonstrated passion for leadership and service
- Ability to demonstrate initiative and the ability to work both independently and collaboratively
- Desire to work with a diverse team of student leaders
- Must demonstrate high level of personal and professional character and be dedicated to delivering more than what is asked
- Previous experience participating in CSLEPS programs and initiatives is preferred
